#### A Message from Your Rector

Dear Friends,

Yesterday, many of you gathered at the weekly Healing Eucharist to participate in a ritual which goes back thousands of years. We came together and brought those negative, draining and sometimes debilitating deeply held beliefs, thoughts, memories, regrets; we brought guilt, shame, beliefs that we aren't enough, or that we are unlovable. We gathered to unburden ourselves of those millstones which we lug around in our broken hearts, and we offered them to God who promises to carry them for us, redeem them and return us to wholeness. Jesus' promise is that his yoke is easy and his burden is light. He also tells us in John's gospel that "I have come that you might have life, and have it to the full," (John 10:10). Yesterday, we took Jesus up on his promise.

Reconciliation of a Penitent – otherwise known as Confession - is a powerful and seldom used rite of the Church. Of course, as Episcopalians we include a corporate confession every Sunday except in certain seasons like Easter, but corporate confession sometimes leaves one without a complete sense of cathartic relief which one might experience with private or semi-private confession. We have the gift of Reconciliation of a Penitent so that we might have a way to unburden ourselves of the toxic and life-threatening broken heartedness that comes with being human in a broken world. Jesus came so that all things could be made new, and that re-creation begins with us and spreads right on through to the natural world. Our Confession, then, allows us to live again as new creatures to the "full" which Jesus promises, and our role in God's economy is to take that new, unburdened, full life in Christ and share it with the world, for the healing of the world. So that at the end of the liturgy we can declare, "The Lord has set us free! Thanks be to God!"

May the Lord of the Broken Hearted and of New Creatures set you free this day and every day.

See you Sunday.
